Alachua/Bradford TIM Team Meeting Wednesday October 14th, 2015

Meeting Minutes





Welcome/Introduction

- Donna Danson opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and asking them to introduce themselves.
- Following introductions, Donna stated the purpose of the meeting is to work together as a team and learn from each other.
- Donna stated there were no comments for the previous Meeting Minutes so they were approved as read.

ITS/511 Update Craig Carnes

- I-75/US 441 Visibility Project The contractor has been late on this project but final testing is expected to begin next week. All signs, cameras and vehicle detectors are up and connected. They are visible from the Gainesville TMC. Integration of this project should be complete in 30 days. A construction project in Jacksonville has disconnected the fiber which is part of the connection to Gainesville. However, Gainesville can run some of the systems from the proprietary software from the vendor. Hoping that the fiber will be back up by the end of this week in order to start the testing.
- I-75 from SR 24 to the Georgia Line The first phase of this project has begun and will include fiber installation. This is an 87 mile project that will be split into approximately 30 mile segments. They will be doing directional bores, trenching activities, putting in pull boxes and splice vaults. The second phase is under design and will include the installation of the power supplies, devices, poles and structures. The first phase is expected to be complete by December of next year. Construction of the second phase will begin once the first phase is complete.
 - Discussion about how many and where the cameras will be on I-75. Cameras will be placed at about every mile, pending no constraints. There will be vehicle detectors every mile, however, within Lake City and Gainesville areas, they will be at 0.5 mile intervals.
 - Discussion of the availability of the information in particular to viewing the cameras.
 WAZE, fl511 and other apps that maybe available. When sent out to the media images and feeds include the 511 logo.
- Construction of the new RTMC (20,000 SF) in Jacksonville is complete and the agencies will be moving in next week. There will be a media day on November 12 if anyone would like to attend.

- Not aware of any issues with 511
- The new jax511 website has been updated

Construction Project Update Ed Seifert

- I-75 Resurfacing south of NW 39th Ave. to north of US 441 and at NW 39th Avenue (SR 222) -Current work includes signing and installing deer fencing on both sides of I-75. The northbound I-75 off-ramp to Northwest 39th Avenue is being extended and widened from two lanes to four to help alleviate traffic backups onto I-75. Work on the I-75 northbound exit ramp to NW 39th Avenue (Exit 390) and U.S. 441 (Exit 399) interchange is expected to be completed first before milling and paving begins on the mainline in late October.
- I-75 Resurfacing north of US 441 to the Santa Fe River Placement of the structural course continues on the mainline. There are nighttime lane closures Sunday through Thursday. There will be detours during construction at the Exit 404 ramp and CR 236 overpass later this year. A flier will be distributed when the detour occurs.
 - The northbound off ramp to Northwest 39th Avenue will be extended and widened to four lanes. That work will be done at night.
 - The two northbound lanes of U.S. 441 in Alachua will close within the next few weeks during construction to lower the roadway to provide more clearance under the overpass. The northbound lanes will be shifted to one temporary lane in the median for approximately 90 days. Northbound and southbound traffic under the overpass will be separated by concrete barrier wall.



- I-75 Resurfacing from Marion County line to south of SR 121 (Williston Road) The project is scheduled to begin later this year.
- Bradford County SR 100 Starke Railroad Crossing Replacement The crossing on SR 100 east of Starke at Camp Blanding will close Monday, October 26 at 10 a.m. and reopen by Friday, October 30 at 5 p.m. to replace the crossing.

Additional Updates provided by the Public Information Office

- Bradford County Starke Railroad Overpass A public meeting to review plans for the new railroad overpass in downtown Starke is scheduled December 1 from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at the Bradford County Fairgrounds.
- Newberry Rd. (SR 26) Resurfacing west of NW 80th Ave. to SW 38th Avenue Work is expected to begin after the first of the year.
- SW 34th Street (SR 121) Resurfacing between Archer Road and NW 5th Avenue Placement of the final friction course is completed. Sidewalk work and final striping continues. The replacement signal at Southwest 2nd Avenue will be installed within the next few months.
- SR 121 LaCrosse sidewalk/Resurfacing Resurfacing and sidewalk construction from Northwest 202nd Place to the CSX railroad crossing in LaCrosse is scheduled for November.

• Reminded that the grading system changed; the Team score previously stayed in the nineties; this time it is 81.9, however compared to the state we are still high. The scoring system is scheduled to change again next year. Inquiry if there was benchmark.

EOC Update Ed Ward

- Teams were sent to the FEMA Super Circular Classes in Clay County today (10/14) and tomorrow (10/15).
- The Division of Emergency Management hosted the 2015 'Current Issues in Emergency Management' session October 6th-8th. The second session will be held October 20th-22nd at the State Emergency Operations Center in Tallahassee.

Agency Reviews Donna Danson

- FHP
 - Lt. Caulk noted that Captain Fincher is doing good and back to work. He will be retiring around Thanksgiving. Captain Tierny, training Lieutenant, will be taking over.
 - There were 8 troopers transferred out and new recruits are currently in training. Two have completed training and six more will start field training next week.
 - There will be some troopers in the I-75 construction zones.
 - The annual wrecker inspections are underway.
 - The deer fence has been working very well.
- City/County Police Departments
 - Williston Police Department
 - Chief Connelly noted the work at the SR 121 Railroad Crossing in Williston took a total of 3 days to complete.
 - FDOT is installing a school zone with flashers at the bus exit on US 41. They are still working with the county road department for another location.
 - Williston Police Department has been working with Holly Walker regarding the Diversion Routes.
- Maintenance/Asset Management
 - Lawrence Rentz mentioned all visitors will need to sign in at the front office.
 - Thomas Cushman with DBi discussed MOT and repairs in construction areas. He asked that DBi still be contacted when there are accidents in those areas.
- Medical Examiner Not present.
- Fire Department
 - Assistant Chief Larry Stewart mentioned there are 13 new hires who will start on Monday.
- Emergency Management
 - Brian Johns mentioned a call he received on his way to the TIM meeting regarding a fire near CR 218 in a construction zone. He was unaware at this time of how bad it was.
- Wrecker Association Nothing to discuss.
- Division of Forestry
 - Jamie Rittenhouse gave a report for Alachua and Bradford Counties. Since the last meeting there haven't been any wildfires in Alachua or Bradford. In Alachua County, there have been 270 authorized burn piles, and 388 authorized fires for a total of 275 acres. In Bradford County, there were 85 authorized burn piles and 29 authorized fires.
- FDEP-BER / Alachua Environmental Nothing to discuss.
- City of Gainesville Not present.

Incident Debrief Donna Danson

- The incident on October 12 on US 301 at NW 257th Street was discussed. It was mentioned that Jorgensen did a great job diverting traffic. The delay was caused by the fuel spill. There was some asphalt damage. DBi noted concerns with swapping out traffic cones.
- The incident on October 7 on US 441 at NW 53rd Avenue was discussed and determined the length of closure was due to traffic pulled off to the side because of the homicide.

- The incident on September 28 on I-75 NB at MM 375 was discussed due to indication of 5 hours. It was identified that the closure was primarily restricted to the emergency lane. General Use lanes were closed for a short period of time.
- It appears that all incidents that were beyond the Open Roads Policy had justification.

• Donna asked the Team to review the TIM Team Mission and Vision statement and to provide comments and/or suggestions to revise the statements. Need to reset for 2015/2016.

Diversion Route Review Holly Walker

• Presentation on Using Diversion Routes. A mock traffic incident scenario was identified which provided an opportunity for discussion on incident management and the opportunities for utilizing the Diversion Maps.
