# Alachua/Bradford TIM Team Meeting

## Wednesday, February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025

### Meeting Minutes

#### **Introductions and TIM Updates**

- Lacey Collins opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.
- Lacey Collins stated the purpose of the meeting is to partner together to reduce incident scene clearance times, deter congestion, and improve safety for everyone on the roadway.
- The December 2024 Alachua/Bradford TIM Team Meeting Minutes were sent to the Team previously, and receiving no comments, they stand as approved.

#### **TIM Discussion: Lacey Collins**

- Struck By Incident statistics for 2023 and 2024
- Reduce struck by incident statistics by:
  - Utilize signs, cones, and emergency lights at all scenes
  - Increase the enforcement of the “Move Over” law
  - Conduct yearly TIM training to all personnel
  - Make TIM a subject matter for monthly/quarterly meetings
  - Do not get complacent, as it could happen at any time to anyone
  - Emphasize safe driving practices to all driver’s when encountered
- National TIM Responder Training presentation for classes
- National TIM Responder Training statistics across the nation
  - Oasis stated they are sending their trainers to “train the trainer” class in Ocala for them to be able to train more employees

#### **Construction Project Update: Jason Evans**

- On going projects throughout the county on state roads, nothing affecting ITS at this time
- There are future plans to rework the RWIS in Payne’s Prairie on US-441
- Fiber Project on US-441 to raise pole boxes that ended up under water the last time the Payne’s Prairie was flooded
- Wrong Way Driver Devices are being placed, unsure location, will be installed in the next several months (Will have locations at the next meeting)
- Attempting to implement Wrong Way Driver Devices at every intersection along the Interstate

#### **Emergency/Maintenance Operations Update: Lacey Collins**

- Lola Butler was unable to provide Emergency Operations update or attend the meeting

- District 2 Emergency Operations is currently still working on clean-up from Hurricane Helene
- No Maintenance Operations update

### **ITS Update/ITS Projects/511/TMC Updates: Jason Evans**

- FL511, no updates, make sure the FL511 app is up to date
- Pilot projects are being deployed in District 5 to get CV connectivity in FL511 to alert people when EMS is nearby along with pedestrian crosswalks. This pilot program is using connected vehicle technology that is tied directly into FL511
- Starting to prep for hurricane season in the TMC

### **Performance Measures: Lacey Collins**

- Lacey Collins provided the Team Performance Measures for the last three months to the Alachua/Bradford Team

### **Incident Review/Debrief: Lacey Collins/Team**

- Incident list provided to Team members
- Alachua/Bradford a total of five major events to review for the last three months
- Three of the five events occurred in Alachua County, the other two occurred in Bradford County
- All five events did not reach the 90-minute roadway clearance goal, three of these incidents had fatalities involved
- Event #1, 12/10/2024, Bradford County, SR-100 and CR-100A; Single vehicle crash with injuries and the powerlines were knocked down, all lanes were blocked in both directions
- Event #2, 12/21/2024, Alachua County, SR-121 and NW 144<sup>th</sup> Ln; Two vehicle crash with injuries and one confirmed fatality, all lanes were blocked in both directions
- Event #3, 12/23/2024, Alachua County, SR-26 and NW 109<sup>th</sup> Dr; Two vehicle crash involving a motorcycle, three confirmed fatalities, all lanes were blocked in both directions
- Event #4, 12/30/2024, Bradford County, SR-100 and SE 11<sup>th</sup> Ave; Single vehicle crash with one confirmed fatality, all lanes were blocked in both directions
- Event #5, 01/18/2025, Alachua County, I-75SB at MM397; Two vehicle crash involving a semi-truck that collided with a stopped Road Ranger truck, all southbound lanes were blocked

### **RISC Debrief: Lacey Collins**

- 01/18/2025, I-75 Sb at MM397, Alachua County
  - First Coast Road Ranger was on scene of an event and had his cones set out for MOT, a semi-truck for unknown reasons traveled through the MOT and collided with the rear of the Road Ranger truck causing significant

damage. Dave's Hi-Way Towing responded for RISC, all lanes southbound were blocked
