Meeting Minutes

Introductions and TIM Updates

- Lacey Collins opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.
- Lacey Collins stated the purpose of the meeting is to partner together to reduce incident scene clearance times, deter congestion, and improve safety for everyone on the roadway.
- The April 2026 Alachua/Bradford TIM Team Meeting Minutes were sent to the Team previously, and receiving no comments, they stand as approved.

TIM Discussion: Lacey Collins

- Struck By Incident statistics for 2025 and 2026
 - So far in 2026, there is a total of 9 struck by incident fatalities
- Hurricane season has officially begun as of June 1st
- Collins provided the TIM team with Rapid Incident Scene Clearance (RISC) overview
 - RISC is a safe, quick clearance of large-scale incidents that have significant impacts on interstates/state roadways and/or will require a complex recovery effort
- July 4th is Independence Day and the celebration of America 250

Emergency/Maintenance Operations Update: Lola Butler, Sarah Hipps

- Still in wildfire season
- Hurricane season has begun and hoping for a calm season
- Maintenance has deployed new signs for road rangers for the sponsorship program

ITS Update/ITS Projects/511/TMC Updates: Jason Evans

- ITS: I-75 and US-441 fiber is being repaired today due to a cut in the fiber. Fiber will be permanently fixed in the upcoming weeks.
- FL511: No update at this time
- RTMC: Active-Vision is fully deployed and being tested to detect pedestrians at this time. Attempted to test wildlife but the sensors were being set off a large amount.

Performance Measures: Lacey Collins

- Lacey Collins provided the Team Performance Measures for the last two months to the Alachua/Bradford Team.

Incident Review/Debrief: Lacey Collins/Team

- Incident list provided to Team members.
- Alachua/Bradford had a total of 8 major events to review for the last two months.
- All 8 events did not reach the 90-minute roadway clearance goal
- Two major events were discussed
 - Event #1, 04/11/2026, Alachua County, SR-24 at NE 53rd Ter.; Sedan was traveling eastbound in the westbound lanes and collided head-on with a pickup truck. Sedan became fully engulfed and the driver was pronounced deceased on scene. The incident lasted approximately 7.75 hours.
 - Event #8, 05/24/2026, Alachua County, SR-24 at 81st St.; Pedestrian was struck by two unknown vehicles who fled the scene. A third vehicle struck the pedestrian and remained on scene. The pedestrian was pronounced deceased; all lanes were blocked for approximately 5.25 hours.

RISC Debrief

- 05/25/2026 I-10 WB at MM263, Madison County: Sedan traveling westbound lost control of the vehicle and collided with a semi-truck and trailer. Sedan was lodged underneath the driver side of the semi-trailer. Passenger of the sedan was pronounced deceased. All Lanes were blocked for approximately 4.5 hours.
