- Scotty opened meeting by doing introductions
- Scotty went over the topics that will be discussed in the meeting
- Scotty discussed Hurricane Ian and lessons learned
  - o 14 days before the storm, will start preparing in the future
  - o Pay rate will be different in the future for hurricanes
  - Asked if anyone has questions, comments
  - Advised everyone did good with the hurricane, all shifts were covered with no call outs
- Scotty advised things to do while driving
  - o Drive in the right lane 5 mph below the speed limit
  - Look 3 times before changing lanes
  - o Do not tailgate vehicles
  - Use plenty of space to get up to speed when merging into traffic
  - Do not stop quickly to get to an event. Go to next exit to turn around
  - Do not use official turn arounds
- Scotty advised first thing you should do when pulling up to an event is create the event
- Scotty advised put sign board down before getting back on the road
  - Arrow boards only rated for 30 MPH
- Scotty advised on fuel events be sure to give dispatch the tag before giving vehicles fuel
- If you are on a 24-hour route, you do not need an overtime code
  - Route 15 is now a 24-hour route so you do not need an over time code when on that route
- Scotty advised hygiene is good, uniforms are clean.
  - If you need anything, make a list
  - If uniforms need to be changed out, put them on top of the box not in the box
- Scotty discussed chain of command with other companies and other employees

- Do not talk about other employees or companies especially on social media
- Scotty advised never take pictures of events
  - o Do not discuss or talk to anyone but law enforcement at the scene of a crash
- Road Rangers can legally use the Law Enforcement turn around or e-lane however, you
  are still responsible if anything happens while doing so
  - Showed a picture of a road ranger involved crash
- Scotty advised there are no procedural errors for the month
- Scotty advised there was only one break time error however, it was during Hurricane Ian
  - O No breaks between 7a-9a and 3p-7p, unless an emergency
  - Shift changes should be done in 5 minutes
- Scotty advised do not call off shift before shift is over
  - No issues
- Scotty went over a few good MOT pictures
  - Do not pick up cones from out of the roadway before moving truck out of the lane of travel
- Scotty went over Road Ranger involved crash pictures
  - How to avoid crashes and pay attention to surroundings
  - Never turn your back to traffic
  - Never sit in the trucks, always stand outside watching traffic
  - Do not get complacent
- Scotty advised all 15 cones should be placed out on all events
  - If TMC is busy, do not sit for a long period of time waiting for a red tag. Get it on the next loop
- Scotty advised do not get in a hurry
  - Place cones out quickly but safely
  - Pick up cones quickly but safely
- Scotty asked if there are any issues with vendors?

- Scotty advised if MOT goes on scene, do not pick cones up until they put their cones down
  - Maintenance does not do E-Lane closures
  - Do not change cones with other vendors
- Scotty reminded all Road Rangers to keep red tags in trucks
  - State Farm logos are coming off the trucks
  - Make sure to have plenty of comment cards
- Scotty advised there is still a month and a half of hurricane season left
  - Stay prepared with a bag ready
  - Food for 3 days
  - Put safe keeping stuff in a ziplock bag
- Scotty went over general safety and chain of command on an event
  - Do not let other vendors/agencies move your cones
  - If someone tells you not to put cones out, explain to dispatch the situation and leave the scene.
- Scotty reminded Road Rangers about cell phone usage
  - o If you need to look at your phone, pull over
  - Do not be on your phone while driving
- Scotty reminded Road Rangers that we do not accept tips
  - No matter circumstance do not accept tip.
    - Automatic termination
- If there is a vehicle issue, you can not recommend any vendor to motorist
  - You can help them look for local companies and assist them on the phone. But you can not recommend or suggest any company
- Scotty reminded Road Rangers all stops must be called in, all cones out and sign boards up on all events
  - You can not assist someone in a parking lot with gas

- If an elderly person or someone with a small child has a flat in a parking lot, ask
   TMC for approval to assist first
- Scotty reminded Road Rangers to never run after hats that blow off into traffic
- Scotty reminded all Road Rangers to take inventory before they leave the yard
  - o If anything is missing and you leave the yard it becomes your responsibility
  - o Keep trucks cleaned
  - o Wipe inside of the trucks down
  - Wash trucks at every shift
- Scotty went over Chain of Command in Jacksonville for the Road Rangers
- Be sure to keep up with CPR certifications and DL expirations
- Scotty concluded the safety meeting
